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Small Group Leader Journal for Teen Girl Ministry (Sample Version)

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HOW TO USE THIS JOURNAL

Let's face it - leading a group of teen girls through a discussion can be quite the challenge! It often seems like they want to do everything *but* have a meaningful discussion. For us as small group leaders, it can be a struggle to balance both spontaneity and organization when it comes to small group time. Some of us struggle to have the time to invest into preparing for lesson or discussion time each week. Others of us easily get derailed from the plans we make when the discussion gets off track. To help with these struggles, this small group leader journal is designed to help you make your small group time a little more organized so you can hopefully better serve your students as their leader.

For each week, there are a total of 4 pages for you to fill out:

Page 1: The Lesson

Page 2: Discussion Time Page 3: Prayer Requests Page 4: Personal Wrap Up

Page 1 is pretty straightforward. You can use it take notes during the lesson time that will help you during your group discussion, including questions you can ask your girls and main takeaways or challenges the speaker gives that the students can act on.

Page 2 is based on a group discussion template. To help guide your discussion, especially if you don't have discussion questions available, there are four steps you can take the move discussion forward:

- <u>Check-In</u> Find creative ways to "check-in" with your girls to see how they are doing personally and emotionally. You can also do an ice breaker question to help everyone get to know each other better. Writing down the question you will ask before you start will help make the transition into discussion time seamlessly.
- **Lesson** Discuss the girls' observations and insights from the teaching
- **Scripture** Reread the main Scripture from the teaching as a group and discussion observations and insights from the passage
- <u>Call to Action</u> Identify at least one way that the girls can take action on what they learned

Page 3 is also pretty straightforward. Keeping track of students' prayer requests can be one of the hardest things to do during discussion

time, especially if your group is large. This page gives you a place to keep track of all of them so you can be intentional about praying over them during the next week or more.

Page 4 is a page you can fill out after your meeting and is meant to help you keep track of things you need to remember for the next meeting, including if you have new girls in your group, any prayer requests you need to spend extra time praying over, ways you can encourage your girls, and reminders of anything you need to do before your next meeting.

I hope these tools will be helpful as you lead your girls through meaningful discussions.


